Whenever a school makes changes to a school uniform, we must be very mindful of cost, which is why at this point we are only asking everyone to change the PE top for September 2021.

CORONAVIRUS, TESTING AND SCHOOL

As I am sure you are aware, families can now collect or order lateral flow test kits for anyone over the age of 18. Follow this <u>link</u> for more details:

If your child has any symptoms of coronavirus such as:

- a high temperature
- a new continuous cough (coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours)
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste (this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal),

please get a test to check if they have coronavirus as soon as possible.

Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get the test result – only leave your home to have a test. Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get the result. The school will let families know if a child or member of staff tests positive. Please remember to follow Government and Public Health advice. When dropping off or picking up your child we would appreciate it if you could remember to social distance to help ensure we keep our community as safe as possible. Thank you.
