### **Attendance and absence**

#### Illness

If your child is ill and unable to attend school, please notify the school office (by calling and leaving a message on our answerphone, via the ParentMail app, by note, or in person) by 9.00am on the first, and each subsequent, day of absence.

If we do not receive such notification, we follow this up immediately to assure the child's safety. We are required by law to record any unauthorised absences so if we are not in receipt of the reason for a child's absence, this will be recorded as unauthorised.

#### Medication

Medicine should only be brought to school if it is essential for your child to take it during the school day. Parents may either call into school and personally administer the medicine or request that a member of school staff administers it to their child. When school staff administer medicines, the parent must supply the medicine in the original pharmacist's container to the School Office and complete a 'Request for school to administer medicine' form obtainable from the School Office.

#### **Appointments**

Please try to schedule medical appointments out of school time whenever possible. If your child needs to keep an appointment in school time, please complete a request form (see below).

#### Holidays and days out

Please note that there is no entitlement to absence for the purpose of holidays, day trips, visiting relatives, or birthday treats etc. and they will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances.

For all absences, other than illness, please complete a request form and send it into school in advance, for authorisation. The form can be downloaded from our <u>website</u> or collected from the office.

### **Communication**

We send newsletters for EYFS/KS1 and KS2 on a monthly basis via the ParentMail app. All other news is communicated via ParentMail as required.

If you have a query that is not answered within this guide, nor on the website, please talk to your child's class teacher in the first instance. They may then refer the enquiry on to a senior teacher or the Headteacher if appropriate. You may also communicate by writing a note in your child's home/school diary, which is read and checked every day.

For all other issues, please contact the office on <u>office@stwilfrids-hh.school</u> who can direct your query to the relevant person. The School Office is open from 8:35 a.m. until 4:00pm.

## **Midday Meals**

All children in EYFS and KS1 are entitled to 'Universal Infant Free School Meals'. Some children in KS2 are also entitled to free school dinners (information about who qualifies and how to claim is available in the pupil premium section). If preferred, packed lunches may be brought to school. We encourage you to send in a packed lunch which will fit in with our 'Healthy School' policy of teaching children the importance of a healthy, nourishing diet. Please remember, no nuts or eggs are permitted due to allergies.

## **Pupil Premium**

The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. Pupil Premium is an important payment for schools and is a good opportunity for eligible parents to get even more support for their children in schools. ## School clubs, wraparound care, and holiday clubs

### School clubs

At St. Wilfrid's, we offer a wide range of clubs that take place before and after school, and during lunchtimes. These include choir, gymnastics, yoga, football, netball, tennis, basketball, Dance Matz, Karate, Lego club and many more!

We try not to cancel after school clubs unless very necessary. If a club is cancelled on the day, you will receive a ParentMail. For clubs led by a teacher, if you are unsure whether a club will run due to bad weather, you can enquire by phoning the office after 2 p.m. Clubs run by an outside provider will go ahead regardless of the weather as they will transfer indoors.

## **School trips**

We enhance the children's experience of learning through school trips and by inviting special visitors to the school. Since the school budget cannot bear the complete cost alone, we request a yearly voluntary contribution (£30 per child) from parents and carers so that we can continue to offer these activities.

To make this less stressful and more financially manageable, the contribution can be paid in one go or in instalments via ParentMail +Pay, from as little as £5 a time. If you would like to spread the cost even more, then a saving card can be arranged through the school office allowing you to pay what you can, when you can.

This covers all trips, visitors and exceptional resources beyond the normal budgeted materials required. The only year groups who are asked to pay for anything else are Years 5 and 6 as they have residential trips, and year 4 for swimming.

## **Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND)**

At St. Wilfrid's, we endeavour to be fully inclusive to all our pupils. We value each child as an individual and want to work with families to ensure positive and happy outcomes for everybody. Pupils learn social skills in their playtime and are expected to play outside unless the weather prevents this, so please ensure your child has a suitable coat for chilly or damp days. We provide some equipment for them to use and have play leaders and peer mediators to assist, and to support children involved in squabbles.

## Uniform, jewellery and hair policy

Please ensure all items of clothing are named. Named lost property will be returned promptly but the school cannot be held responsible for items that are unmarked.

The school uniform list is detailed below:

- St. Wilfrid's sweatshirt or cardigan available from the School Office
- White polo shirt
- Grey skirt, tunic or divided grey skirt, grey trousers or shorts
- White/grey socks or navy blue/grey tights
- Navy blue and white dress (may be worn in the summer term and the first half of the autumn term)
- Sensible black shoes/ankle boots no boots above the ankle please

#### P.E. and Games kit

Please ensure your child's P.E kit is placed in a clearly named drawstring bag. This will be kept at school on your child's peg and returned at the end of each half term for washing.

The P.E kit required is:


- St. Wilfrid's T-shirt- available from the School Office
- Navy Shorts / skort
- Black plimsolls (or trainers in KS2)
- Navy tracksuit and trainers—KS2 only
- Football boots—optional (no metal studs or blades)
- Swimming costume and towel (Y4 only)

#### **Jewellery and Hair policy**

For both health and safety and security reasons, we prefer children not to wear jewellery at all in school. However, children are permitted to wear a simple stud earring in each ear, which must be removed for all PE lessons. If your child is unable to do this independently; earrings should be removed before school on the day your child has PE. No member of staff within school is allowed to help children remove their earrings. The only other permitted jewellery is a watch.

Children with long hair (at or below shoulder length) should wear it tied up.
